How would Jesus lead a small group?



facilitator: \fə- 'si-lə- ,tā-tər\ Function: noun: one that helps to bring about an outcome (as learning, productivity, or communication) by providing indirect or unobtrusive assistance, guidance, or supervision.

Facilitating is not just another word for teaching, but represents a very different way of helping adults learn through interactive discussion. Rather than being the “answer person” or lecturer, the facilitator is more like a guide, framing questions so that others learn through a shared journey of discovery.

Entrust Facilitator Training is for:

- adult Bible fellowship group leaders
- adult Sunday school teachers
- men’s and women’s small group leaders
- parachurch leaders and workers
- teachers and seminar leaders
- missionaries
- pastors



Entrust Facilitator Training benefits the local church, in that the training is:

- **transferable:** participants draft a personal strategy for implementing what they have learned. Once they have successfully completed Facilitator Training, they can be involved with leading other local Facilitator Training events.
- **sustainable:** as local church and ministry leaders gain experience putting into practice what they have learned, they become a resource for future training within the church or organization.
- **transformational:** students are challenged to think and live biblically, which leads to transformed churches that impact their communities.



Entrust Facilitator Training Groups are:

- limited to a maximum of 12 participants
- presented in various formats (generally, a 3-day intensive)
- reinforced by practical hands-on opportunities: observation, experiencing the process, leading peer-evaluated groups
