Some 40 Christian leaders, serving God amidst civil war and government persecution in this Asian country, gained encouragement at a day-long seminar about suffering, offered by an Entrust couple from a neighboring nation. It was the first time since COVID anyone had come to minister to these weary leaders.




Responding to the widely recognized need for discipleship in Spain, Entrust's Iberia Project team facilitated ministry trainings in Madrid, Barcelona and Málaga. Men and women of various generations bonded as they practiced group management skills and how to lead a transformative Bible discussion.



Forty-five women from Uganda, Chad, Zambia, Zimbabwe, South Africa, Ethiopia, Ghana and Namibia came together in Kenya for a 7-day Entrust Equipping Women intensive training. They overcame obstacles, experienced miracles and grew in ministry skills transferable to their individual contexts.



Among the students who completed a 2-year course of study at Entrust's Bible Institute in the Middle East, was one who said, "I was very hopeless and without any plan for my life. But after taking courses at the Bible Institute, I found that in fact God has a plan for my life and I have given my heart to a ministry that will help people to get to know him."



The International College of Bible and Missions in South Africa welcomed 30 students from different countries and cultural backgrounds. Each is a recognized ministry leader, eager to gain needed knowledge and skills to grow even stronger in leadership.



Several Guiding Transformational Small Groups workshops in Austria and Serbia gave believers fresh understanding of small group leadership. One Serb's reaction: "We got excellent feedback as we led a short Bible study in a small group." An Austrian told us, "I didn't know how to lead a small group before, but now I feel I could do it."


